Guelph Forklift License - In North America, obtaining a forklift license or forklift certification involves hands-on and classroom training. Regulatory control over certification, training and license for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of state, provincial and federal groups. Operators may acquire a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. Regardless, regulatory requirements must be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

The forklift is a powered industrial machinery which is designed together with many options, like stand-up and sit down models, electric and propane versions, and different sizes and types to meet the industrial needs of workers. Operator training programs are normally individualized to address the specific kinds and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down forklift in a warehouse surroundings will not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up lift truck in a shipyard. The variety of lift trucks and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all industries and machines. Regulatory standards, therefore, have a tendency not to concentrate on particular program requirements but instead on the outcome of individual training courses.

On the job training which is supplied by the employer is the most common way of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who provides this method of certification is required to offer practical training and classroom sessions on equipment at their place of work. Employers could choose to train employees on each kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The course incorporates forklift operation procedures, safety measures, company rules and lift truck maintenance. Topics particular to the worksite, such as hazardous materials or conditions, should be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and utilize each type of forklift on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor normally needs an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

Usually, an employer-provided certification will not transfer from the existing employer to the next employer. Obtaining a forklift license through employer-provided training permits the operator to operate a lift truck for that employer only.

The most vital aspect of lift truck license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements vary from one type of machine to another. Safety problems differ from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to deal with extra requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like in marine and offshore uses.
