Guelph Boom Lift Operator Training - A cherry picker refers to a kind of aerial work platform. Cherry pickers include a bucket or platform at the end of a hydraulic lifting system. The machine is also called a man lift, boom lift, hydraladder or basket crane.

The bucket or platform is usually mounted on the rear of a large vehicle like for example a truck, that is sometimes called a bucket truck. A self-moving platform, stand-alone trailer or flat back pickup van may likewise be used. The worker stands and starts working in the bucket. The individual in the bucket normally comprises an upper set of controls enabling control of the position of the bucket. The bucket's reach could be extended on some models by telescoping in order to adjust the lifting arm. Safety controls that are automatic prevent tipping. Articulated boom lifts are suggested for working in tight spaces or when it is needed to clear obstacles.

As the name implies, cherry pickers were made for picking fruit in trees at high levels. Cherry pickers are used in different other businesses, like for example construction, mining and exterior painting. Sometimes they are utilized for cleaning windows on high structures. The machines are used to service electrical equipment, telephone and cable television on utility poles. Sometimes, firefighters utilize cherry pickers, know as snorkels, when ladders are insufficient. During Christmas season, civic workers could be seen hanging lights and banners within cherry pickers.
